**About the role/family:** **SENNIES** is excited to support a family of 5 find a flexible part-time Sennie to integrate themselves into a busy household. Mum is a classical musician who tours the world and works on a freelance basis, which means her schedule is different each month depending on her work. Dad is also a musician but with a slightly more predictable schedule. They have three wonderful children, and they are working towards turning down the emotional temperature and finding a higher level of regulation for everyone within their home. They have a number of strategies in place - including a trampoline in their kitchen - to encourage the sensory seekers to move, regulate and find calm. The property is located behind a security line which will require their new Sennie to undergo significant and advanced police checks. Please note this is out of the family's control and is non-negotiable.

**About the child/children:** **G11** is creative, kind, intelligent, independent, capable and a very trustworthy tween! She will need guidance more than care and is fantastic at lending a helping hand! She loves music, dance, creating art and her favourite thing: **READING!**

**G9** is an intelligent, highly capable and, more often than not, an absolute darling to be around! She loves to make movies on her iPad (live-action, which she edits); creative writing; loves to research information; adores animals and TV shows about animals. She's a great reader too! The **VITAL** piece of information about G9, she runs away when emotionally overloaded. Predicting these moments is near impossible, but knowing that jealousy,

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embarrassment and justice are three big triggers can be of assistance. **G9 has a diagnosis of Autism and is currently on the waiting list for an ADHD assessment.** She has an EHCP at school and is currently attending neuro-development therapy.

**B6** is a sweet, deeply loving and caring little boy who loves to colour in, draw, cut out, paint, write, and play with trains and number blocks! He adores his big sisters, and when they are sad, he will dash around to fetch their favourite items of theirs to bring them comfort. He is a WRIGGLER and finds it almost impossible to sit still. He goes to ballet and swimming lessons and loves to leap about. Books are a passion, and he can bring you books to read for hours. **B6 is suspected to have ADHD as he struggles with emotional regulation** and staying in his seat when attending school, however, this is yet to be confirmed.

All children have a busy schedule of activities, and most are within walking distance to the family home; however, B6 and G9 will need to be driven to school.

**This role would suit:** Someone who doesn't want to work full-time! A graduate/student doing further study. An SEN Nanny/Sennie or someone who has worked in a school as a 1:1 or teaching assistant supporting children with additional needs. The family are very open to all candidates and will consider all options around employment to find the right match including hiring 2 Sennies. The crucial factors are patience and a calm demeanour. Imposing lots of rules and boundaries beyond that which the family have already set is not welcome. The flexibility of thought and approaching difficulties is key. Therefore we are looking for a Sennie with the ability to put themselves in the situation and decrease anxiety for all instead of raising it.

The family can be flexible in terms of the hours and contract offered. Please let us know your preference in terms of being self-employed or salaried and if you would prefer a zero-hour contract or a mutually agreed amount of hours per month with the potential for overtime if you are available? As stated above the ideal offer would be 70 hours per month but this can be increased or decreased to suit the right candidate.
