About the role/family: SENNIES is seeking a patient and empathetic Sennie to support a family after a difficult separation. Both children live with their Dad full-time where the Sennie will support in creating a loving and safe space for G14 and B11. G14 is currently unschooled, therefore the Senie will be responsible for providing care and support to G14, as well as undertaking some housework duties throughout the day.

The Sennie's responsibilities will involve creating a structured and engaging environment that supports the development and well-being of the children. Developing warm and nurturing relationships with the children, fostering trust, security, and emotional stability, will be a central aspect of the role. Additionally, the Sennie will be responsible for planning and organising age-appropriate activities, outings, and educational opportunities to enhance the social, cognitive, and physical development of the children. The Sennie will also need to attend to housekeeping tasks during the day, ensuring a clean, organised, and safe household environment. This includes tidying communal areas, doing laundry, preparing meals, and occasionally grocery shopping.

Occasional overnight duties will be required, and these will be agreed upon in advance by both the Sennie and the family. The family can provide live-in accommodation if needed, either within the family home or in a nearby flat approximately 1.5 miles away. However, they are also open to a live-out arrangement for candidates who live nearby, to ensure a manageable commute and promote a healthy work-life balance.

About the child/children: G14 is an extremely bright and sensitive young girl, who, in her earlier years, exuded a vibrant and outgoing personality, effortlessly making friends and engaging with others. However, since transitioning to secondary school, particularly around Year 8, she has encountered difficulties in forming and maintaining friendships, hinting at a potential neurodiverse profile. This shift has been accompanied by a noticeable change in her social interactions and communication patterns, as well as her overall demeanour. Despite these challenges, she continues to find solace and joy in creative outlets, particularly drama and dance.

At present G14 is undergoing an assessment for potential ASD/ADHD and is actively participating in therapy sessions. The Sennie's role will involve assisting G14 in boosting her confidence, managing anxiety, and fostering emotional well-being. Additionally, the Sennie will support G14 in understanding and cultivating healthy



friendships and relationships. Although G14 may return to school in the upcoming academic year, this change will not impact the Sennie's working hours.

B11 is a fun and friendly young boy who exhibits a strong passion for Minecraft or whatever subject he's currently delving into at school. His fascination with these interests is evident. Despite his dedication to his hobbies and academic pursuits, B11 sometimes encounters difficulties in navigating friendships. However, his keen interest in learning remains a consistent trait. He eagerly engages with new concepts and topics, always seeking to expand his knowledge. This enthusiasm not only drives his academic progress but also fosters a sense of curiosity and exploration in various aspects of his life.

The Sennie will assist B11 in developing self-reliance and fostering friendships, especially in larger social settings. This involves encouraging him to become more independent and confident in handling tasks and challenges on his own. Additionally, helping him navigate social situations, build connections, and feel comfortable interacting with peers, especially in larger group settings, will be important. Through supportive guidance and encouragement, the goal is to empower him to develop a sense of autonomy and establish meaningful relationships with others.
