**About the role/family: SENNIES** is seeking a patient and empathetic Sennie to assist a family going through a separation. The children primarily reside at their mother's home, while their father lives in Swanage. The Sennie will provide support to the children during their time at their father's place, where live-in accommodation is available.

The children's father recognizes the importance of understanding his son's needs and is actively educating himself to provide optimal support. As he continues to learn how best to assist B5, we aim to offer necessary assistance in a considerate and respectful manner.

The Sennie's responsibilities will include creating a structured and engaging environment that supports the development and well-being of the children. This will involve incorporating therapeutic activities and play-based learning to support their growth. The Sennie will implement individualised care plans and strategies recommended by therapists and healthcare professionals to meet the unique needs of B5. Building warm and nurturing relationships with the children, promoting trust, security, and emotional stability, will be a key aspect of the role. Additionally, the Sennie will be responsible for planning and organising age-appropriate activities, outings, and educational opportunities to enhance the social, cognitive, and physical development of the children. B5's diagnosis of autism has led to the implementation of comprehensive support measures both at home and at school to ensure he receives the necessary assistance and accommodations

Overall, B5's journey with autism is characterised by a nurturing and supportive network that prioritises his interests, needs, and well-being. Through the collaborative efforts of his family and school community the Sennie will become part of the nurturing team.
